Lexington County Sets Re-employment Pace for May. Strong Employment Growth Expected

Lexington County's employment in May was 2.45% greater than April and outpaced the region and the State. A total of 3,330 jobs were filled as a result with the majority of jobs in the accommodation and food service, construction, and health care sectors. The strong growth highlighted through the ManpowerGroup's survey found that 27% of employers in the Columbia MSA expect to hire in the 3rd quarter. That response placed the region as the top MSA in the nation for expected job growth.

Economic Development Briefs

Not seasonally adjusted County employment in May was 139,349, up 3,330, or 2.45% from the month prior. COVID-impacted employment hit its lowest at 136,019 in the month of April. Lexington County outpaced employment growth of the Columbia MSA (2.36%) and the South Carolina (2.44%) over the same period. May's unemployment rate was 8.2%, up from 2.8% one year ago.

Comparing the most current available industry data, the top growth sectors in the County from the 4th quarter 2018 to the 4th quarter 2019 were: administrative support and waste management, manufacturing, health care and social services, information, and public administration. See chart.








Projects in the Pipeline

The County of Lexington, Department of Economic Development staff is working on 14 active projects. These projects have an estimated new investment potential of \$353.6 million, and the potential to create 1,163 new jobs. Of the 14 active projects, one is at the announcement pending stage valued at \$8.5 million in new investment.
